Reprinted together as *The Continent* in Item 1213 of Toynbee's *Bibliography (A Journey to China; or, Things which are seen)*, London, Constable, 1931), these articles were the original of chapter XXIX (ivi, pp. 182-193). They were neither identified as such nor listed at all by S. Fiona Morton.

No. 269 was subdivided in an introductory section and two further paragraphs – *Two Troupes of Players* and *Seoul*; no. 270 was subdivided in an introductory section and three further paragraphs: *A Chinese Victory*, *Modernising Mukden*, *A Monument*.
