## NOTE

Reprinted as *The Isles of the Sea* in Item 1213 of Toynbee's *Bibliography (A Journey to China; or, Things which are seen*, London, Constable, 1931), this article was the original of chapter XXIII, pp. 150-153. It was neither identified as such nor listed at all by S. Fiona Morton.

It was introduced by the English newspaper with the following words: «Professor Toynbee is contributing a series of articles to the "Manchester Guardian" while travelling to China and Japan by way of the Near and Middle East. He describes in the following article the impressions created by the five British ports at the gates of Asia».

The original article was subdivided in an introductory section and four further paragraphs – *Five Island Ports, Their Undiluted Westernism, A Catholic Cathedral, A Latin Culture*
