I have long felt that British position in Cyprus is untenable (...). I have a feeling that many people in England are prepared to support Greeks claims in rather a light-hearted way so long as it costs nothing to the British Empire – an irresponsible attitude which, I believe, in the long run does Greece more harm than good. The test will be whether English public opinion comes up to its principles in a case where we are called upon to make political sacrifices ourselves, instead of merely expressing a platonic opinion that other people ought to do so; and it is a particularly good test, because the cause of the Cypriot Greeks happen to be so overwhelmingly strong,
